Auxiliary Verbs: Be, Have, Do

Auxiliary verbs, also called helping verbs, are used with main verbs to form different tenses, voices, and moods. In this worksheet, we will focus on the auxiliary verbs **be, have,** and **do**.

Be is used to form continuous tenses and the passive voice. *Example:* She **is** studying. / The cake **was** made yesterday.

Have is used to form perfect tenses. *Example:* They **have** finished their homework.

Do is used for questions, negatives, and emphatic sentences. *Example:* **Do** you like ice cream? / I **do** not know.
