Comparatives and Superlatives Worksheet

Comparatives and superlatives are used to compare people, places, things, or ideas.

- **Comparatives** are used to compare two things. They often end in **-er** (e.g., taller, bigger) or use **more** before the adjective (e.g., more beautiful, more interesting).
- **Superlatives** are used to compare three or more things and show the highest degree of a quality. They often end in **-est** (e.g., tallest, biggest) or use **most** before the adjective (e.g., most beautiful, most interesting).
- Some adjectives have **irregular forms**, such as **good** → **better** → **best** and **bad** → **worse** → **worst**.
